A native of Atlanta, Ga., Vince Graham is a 1986 graduate of the University of Virginia who moved to the South Carolina Lowcountry in 1989. In 1991, he founded the traditional walking neighborhood Newpoint in Lady's Island, S.C., combining modern advances with time-tested urban principles.

Since that time, he has participated in building seven other neighborhoods including the Village of Port Royal, Broad Street, I'On, Morris Square, Hammond's Ferry and Mixson in South Carolina, as well as East Beach in Virginia.

These neighborhoods have been the recipients of numerous design and environmental stewardship awards and have been the subject of articles and stories in numerous media such as The Wall Street Journal, Builder Magazine, Landscape Architecture, National Geographic, Home & Garden Television, CNN and the BBC.

Graham serves on the Board of Charleston Moves, the Coastal Conservation League, the East Cooper Planning Council, the Lowcountry Housing Trust, the Riley Institute for Urban Affairs and Upstate Forever. He also works with the Metropolitan Leadership Council of the Brookings Institution, is a South Carolina Liberty Fellow and a member of the Church of the Holy Cross.

Graham is a passionate advocate for advancing human-scaled urbanism and has spoken at architectural and planning symposiums in Australia, Europe, and throughout the United States. He currently lives on Sullivan's Island in a former church that he restored and which is known to locals as "the castle."
